Graduated in Physiotherapy (2013) and Master in Cardio-Respiratory Physiotherapy (2015) by School of Health (ESS – P. Porto). He obtained his Doctorate in Physiotherapy from the Faculty of Sport of the University of Porto (2022). His doctoral dissertation was on the development of an incremental step test to assess exercise capacity in people with chronic obstructive pulmonary disease.



Currently, he is a Full Professor of Physiotherapy at School of Health Fernando Pessoa and also an Integrated Researcher in the area of Human Movement System (Re)habilitation at the Center for Rehabilitation Research (CIR). He is the author of several publications and has participated in several national and international conferences. His research interests are: i) development, translation and cultural adaptation of patient-reported outcome measures (PROMs) and patient-reported experience measures (PREMs); ii) explore and determine psychometric and measurement properties of PROMs, PREMs and field tests (exercise and functional capacity) in different populations; iii) determine normative values and reference equations of field tests for the Portuguese population.
